Financials- Next Board Meeting will Approve the June Budget for 2023-24 As well as the LCAP.

Charter School Development Center, CSDC, recommended diversifying cash for over the FDIC insurance limits of \$250,000 because of the unstable bank environment.

The La Vida Funding Determination was approved at 100% for two years by the State Board of Education on May 19.

Insurance renewal we may reduce certain coverages in order to stay flat for expenditures.

Academics- All testing complete. A few more students took the Smarter Balanced Test than last year and previous years. The ELPAC was not fully attended.

Special Ed: Getting ready to submit a new Compliance form this year by June 30 on the minutes of services students received.

Held 7 IEP meetings in which two were senior exits, one was an initial.

Cyber Attack- The Website is mostly online now, thanks to the Rescue and rebuilding By Andrew Miller. The affected County Server is still down.

Trainings: Teachers are signing up for Summer Waldorf Trainings. 4 will attend a first ever virtual conference on the High School.

Teachers: All teacher signed that they were returning on the Intent to Return form. Hiring a EC for both Elementary and High School would allow taking on a few More students that we have been having to turn away.

Several teachers will work on special projects over the summer, such as submitting new courses for A-G accreditation, Establishing the Career and Technical Education CTE Pathway program, creating the Mindfulness practices for next year,

Students: Portfolios are coming in.

Four 8th Graders and eight Seniors received Diplomas. Two seniors have a few units to finish up next year.

Three major end of year events were held with wonderful student engagement. They were the Fun and Games Event, Community Thursday and Senior Graduation. Eigth Grade Graduation was not held because none of the students wanted to attend. Personal Acknowledgement will happen at the final EC meetings.

Site: The new storage shed was built by the Home Depot crew. Moving out of Kinderhouse starts next week.
