## **DIRECTOR'S REPORT:** May be expanded at the meeting.

**Enrollment**: 75, This is the time of the mid year transition. Students exited including three for noncompliance. Four more are in process of enrollment with a total of 12 new enrollments since the return from winter break.

Financials: Review of Board Account.

**Audit:** All requests and selections for the 2022-23 year have been submitted. There was an in person audit on January 22<sup>nd</sup>. Three came including the owner of the company John Robertson.

**Willits Unified:** The La Vida and the other charters presented the End of Year Report Willits Unified Board on Thursday January 11.

Regular check in meetings continue with Superintendent Beebe, but less often.

This year would have been the charter renewal year. The dates have been extended because of the pandemic to June 2027.\*

**Academics:** Weekly Check in Report Cards mailed this week, a little behind schedule. The top 20% is greater than the bottom 50%. This is an improvement. Approximately 30 students will receive a \$7 Starbucks gift card award and another 20 for improvement will receive calligraphy felt tip pens.

The Elementary Benchmark Project Fair was a big success with a great turn out of families. A few turned in late and we may have had 100% participation. High School was less attended but with some worthy research papers and career projects. Quite a few students will receive the Excellence Ribbon along with everyone receiving the participation ribbon.

**Teachers**: All the ECs attended the Alliance for Public Waldorf Education virtually. It was a different format this year.

The mentors and director attended Waldorf in 3D about the changing curriculum in Waldorf Education with Eugene Schwartz who highlighted La Vida as an example of a future version of Waldorf Education.

A retired teacher, Sierra Knight, moved onto the ranch and will sub for La Vida and possibly teach specialty classes.

**Students:** Elementary Student were prepared to give little presentations of the benchmark projects and more had accompanying papers than ever before. Engagement was fantastic. One brave soul played a Renaissance era song on the violin. High school Community Thursday went very well with several new students attending.

K-4 grades went to the Hopland Field Station for the Lamb Experience. They have also been doing felting and stories about sheep and wool.

**Special Ed**: 2 IEPs were held. There has been only a 15% cancellation rate with Tiny Eye for Speech and OT.

**Site:** Phone outages- continued, but seem to be fixed now.

Both septic systems had issues because of the storms. The one was quite serious. The hot water heater went out during Community Thursday. All appear to be fixed at this time.

**Coming up:** Next Board Meeting February 7. February is Read-A-Thon month. Spirit days are planned for each week.
