**DIRECTOR'S REPORT:** A showing of the Orientation power point and photos of the Wild dye plant day if there is time.

**Enrollment**: 66 with openings in K-8 Home only.

**Financials** - Chris Russell, Business Manager is working on the closing of the financials for 2023-24.

**Academics:** The Launch of the new Math and Reading Intervention Program, My Path, Has begun. There was a training webinar for parents on Friday the first day of school. The Placement Test / Diagnostic results show more than half the students are below grade level in math and about half are below in reading.\*

**Inservice and Orientation**: There are changes this year which were the focus for both, the Inservice and Orientation. The Back to Basics theme with the introduction of the My Path curriculum and assessment, the Specialty Intensives for both elementary and especially for High School, the requirements of the Virtual Classes and the staff changes were a lot for people to take in.

Separate My Path trainings occurred for Teachers and Parents. The Oak Meadow company was hugely supportive of the school, providing three overview webinars for Parents and teachers for both elementary and high school separately. They also sent a significant amount of new curriculum samples and complimentary pencil sharpeners and pencils that were give aways at parent orientation.

Teachers also had a introduction to the Newsela curriculum which will be offered as a Reading intervention for Jr High and High School Science and High School Social Studies.

High turn out for Orientation 90%. The others will watch prerecorded video Orientations in order to receive their curriculum. 90% had curriculum for the first day and the others will have theirs when the come in to pick it up.

**Staff:** The resignation of Fawn Bassett, key teacher, two weeks before school starting has been a big adjustment for both staff and families. Two teacher's were hired to replace her, one for onsite classes, Julie Drucker, and one for the EC, Melissa Petitt of Covelo. Melissa resigned on Thursday after the emergency lock down in Covelo where her three children attend school. So the EC aspect is still open. Ms Angela and Mr Jimmy are covering the EC portion until we find someone.

Dory Haselwerdts, the new Student Services Liaison has been a super productive asset.

**Parent Square** had a special section at Orientation and the four clicker pen for those who signed up. People were great about getting on board.

**Students:** 30 students were with their parents at Orientation and really enjoyed the Oak Meadow wooden airplane kits.

The First Guest Artist Intensive occurred with Nikki Livingston Tsukamoto and husband Yusuke and Leyna Lightman It was a rich integrated learning experience incorporating the ranch abundance. Teachers and students were happy to experience what was offered by these master teachers at the top of their field. Yusuke proved high quality photos of the event.

Peace Day Ice Cream Social with Apple crisps this year was very well attended and a Successful back to school event.

**Trainings:** Summer training for teachers was the re taking the Waldorf Core Principles Trainings by Eugene Schwartz. These will be the topic for two or three Teacher Learning Communities this year.

There were three Oak Meadow webinars for different audiences. Two My Path webinars and one Newsela. All related to curriculum.

**Site:** Replacing the wood chips in the swing set area was a big project and thanks to the Golden Rule for their help and use of the backhoe. New Survellance cameras replaced the out side set. Tables, & benches received a new coat of paint thanks to Dan Miller.

New Housekeeping contractor: Clean Green Service, whose owner Veronica is excellent at her profession and has a niece who was a former student. She is kind enough to work With our budgetary restrictions.
