#### **DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

School Development Center.

**Enrollment**: 69, The Window for new enrollments is now closed. Eight new students enrolled which means a busy intake and orientation meetings as well as setting up each one with a personal curricular program.

Board Training- part 1 of required Ethics Training. 1 hour. virtual from the Charter

**Financials** - The 2<sup>nd</sup> Interim Budget was submitted on the due date March 17 The Funding Determination first step was on April 8 with the ACCS, Advisory Commission on Charter Schools. However La Vida was not included. We are waiting To hear what happened. The second and final step is the State Board of Education, SBE, May 7-8 Meeting.

P-2 Attendance Reporting is happening now and will be submitted on Thursday. This Is the most important attendance report of the year, as it determines our revenue rate for This year and until mid-year next year.

CALPADS Fall 2 was submitted on time by edMagic.

The Civil Rights Report was submitted. This is large and difficult demographic report.

**Academics:** Currently the Smarter Balanced Assessment, SBAC is being proctored on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We hope to improve the participation rate by just one or two Students.

MAP test participation for Spring was 94%.

The new students coming in are taking the MY PATH Placement test for Math and Reading. This has been a positive addition to the assessment suite. However more engagement should be happening for the supplemental curriculum portion. 45% of the students that are one or two grade levels behind are participating. Because it is new,

reteaching the procedures to the parents is the action step on the table at the moment.

ELPAC Test for English Language Learner test was proctored for three weeks in February. All applicable students took some or all of the test. However there were absences and not all students completed the test even with extended Makeup opportunities.

The Physical Fitness Test is mid stream. All Onsite 5<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> graders have taken it and The 9<sup>th</sup> grade and home only students will take it early May.

Students did well with their lines in the Robin Hood play, Still to come islearning the folk dancing for the May Pole and Archery.

High School Intensives have been productive: CPR and First Aid training with Skip Williams was very educational. Only Five out of 12 passed all three tests for certification. Finch Robotics was a big hit with full on engagement.

Nineteen out of twenty-eight High School students attended the Benchmark Project Fair on Community Thursday, Archrey, intensive with Derick Almena is coming up at the end of April. African Cooking and one more Community Thursday in May.\*

**Teachers:** Teacher Learning Communities have focused on Student Strengths and Personal Intelligences, and using the practices brought third lecture from Eugene Schwartz on the Core Principles of Waldorf Education, specifically on Relationships. On April 23, Eugene will work directly with teachers again, on working with Parents and with students that experience anxiety and trauma.

Recruiting for next year and have two excellent candidates.

**Special Ed:** Three IEPs and one 504 were held in February. And 2 IEPs for March to mid April.

Two important reports were submitted. The new accountability report for Special Ed.\* The Small LEA Cyclical Monitoring, La Vida is in the Cycle B group.

The second was the Timeline Compliance Data in the Annual Determination Letter. This was the first time we participated.

The annual meeting with Tiny Eye occurred in setting up next year's agreement. Their prices went up a couple dollars per hour.

**Site**: (from March) Received a wonderful donation of Archery equipment from the Mendocino County Sheriffs Activity League. It is a large donation of equipment that they no longer had a

leader for. There will be classes for Elementary and High School this spring and Demonstrations at two events open to the public. Some experienced and passionate archers who work with children have been recommended and are willing to work with La Vida.
